



Dr Jun MAO

Dr. Mao is the Chief of the Integrative Medicine Service and the Laurance S. Rockefeller Chair in Integrative Medicine at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. He is a board-certified family physician with added qualifications in hospice and palliative care. He is also an experienced and licensed acupuncturist who combines western and eastern approaches to manage pain and symptoms in cancer patients. Dr. Mao's program of research focuses on investigating the effects, mechanisms, and integration of Complementary and Integrative Medicine (CIM) for symptom management in cancer. He has advanced research training in clinical epidemiology and extensive experience conducting acupuncture, pain, and symptom science clinical trials, as well as health services research among cancer patients (enrolled over 3,000 patients in survey research and over 400 patients in clinical trials in the last five years). Dr. Mao has published over 80 peer-reviewed research manuscripts, three book chapters, and multiple comments and reviews. He is the President of the Society for Integrative Oncology, an international organization with 458 members from 19 countries dedicated to the science and integration of evidence-based complementary approaches in conventional cancer care.
