

Professor LI, Min

Prof. Min LI is a professor and director of Teaching and Research Division in the School of Chinese Medicine, Hong Kong Baptist University. She obtained a bachelor's degree from Henan College of Traditional Chinese Medicine in 1985, a master's degree from Guangzhou University of Chinese Medicine in 1988 in China, and a doctor's degree from School of Medicine, Tokai University in 2001 in Japan. Currently, Prof. LI is also a director of Mr. & Mrs. Ko Chi-Ming Centre for Parkinson's Disease Research and an associate director of Clinical Division in the School of Chinese Medicine, Hong Kong Baptist University. Prof. LI was awarded as the distinguished female Chinese medicine practitioner by the China Association of Chinese medicine in 2007. Prof. LI's research is focus on the investigation of the neuroprotective effects and underlying mechanisms of Chinese medicine on the neurodegenerative diseases including Parkinson's disease (PD) and Alzheimer's disease (AD), clinical study of the efficacy and safety of Chinese medicine in treatment of neurodegenerative disease, as well as on the discovery of natural autophagy inducers for treatment neurodegenerative diseases from Chinese medicine. Prof. LI has been the Editor-in-Chief and member of the editorial board of 20 professional books, she has also published over 80 scientific papers, over 120 poster or oral presentations in the international conferences and obtained several US patents.
